Power of attorney authorising the Philip Vautort, Rector of Moreton (Hampstead), to act as agent for the Convent in Devonshire.

LATIN TEXT

PROCURATORIUM DE DOCKOMBE

Pateat universis quod. nos Robertus, etc. Prior Ecclesie Christi Cantuariensis et ejusdem loci Capitulum dilectum nobis in Christo Dominum Philippum Wantort, rectorern ecclesie de Morton Exoniensis diocesis, nostrum verum et legitimum procuratorem, negotiorum gestorem, et nuntium specialem facimus, ordinamus, et constituimus, etc.; dantes eidem generalem potestatem, etc. fructus, redditus, et proventus, ac emolumenta quecumque manerii nostri de Dockumbe, in comitatu Devoniensi situati, colligendi, exigendi, etc. In cujus rei, etc. Data in domo nostra capitulari xvij. die mensis Julii anno Domini MCCC quinquagesimo.

Power of attorney at Doccombe

Let it be known to all that we Robert etc Prior of Christ Church Canterbury and the Chapter of the same place have made, ordained and appointed our beloved in Christ Dom Philip Wantort [Vautort] rector of the church of Morton in the Exeter Diocese our true and legitimate attorney, negotiator and special representative: giving to

[him] the same general power etc. to collect and exact fruits, rents and produce and emoluments of whatsoever kind of our manor of Doccombe situated in the county of Devon. In [testimony] of which thing etc. Given in our chapter [house] July 17th 1350.
