SUMMARY

Doccombe 11 MAY 1327

Memorandum of a power of attorney given to the agent of the Chapter in Devonshire, Henry of Lappeflode. (See L. 385)

TRANSLATION

'Henry of Lappeflode has the proxy and power, before any ecclesiastical legal proceedings, for the rights and liberties of us and our church to be: petitioned, defended, conserved and upheld, conducted, protested, tended, excepted, reflected, declined, producing searches and instruments [of law], opposing accusations and desertion, seeking and receiving estimated expenses, interests, and damages, and doing further in the premisses which are canonically constituted by the institution.

Given at Canterbury May 11th 1327 – to be valid only after a fully completed year.'
