Letter, dated 2 December, 1765. To Richard Halford at Canterbury about delivering the money to him to pay the fine for renewing the lease of Doccombe Manor & paying £438 13s, the amount he thought too much.

For the Fine of Mr Katenkamp's Renewal with the Dean & Chapter of Canterbury; but as Mess[er]s Hoares have No account with that Body (only with Yourself, they supposing I expected a receipt , on account of the Dean & Chapter) told the Messenger they could not give it in that form, and he accordingly brought back the Notes again; it was a Misapprehension, for their receipt on Your Particular account would have been to all Intents and Purposes the same. However, as the Notes were returned me I think it Best to send you them, in Halves for Greater Security of Conveyance, Part by thier Post & the remainder Shall follow <by> tomorrow's. Mr Bargrave was not at home when I went this Morning to Enquire about the Leases I shall renew my Application Tomorrow, I am
