Doccombe Tenements – Mr Babbacombe

Bapt. 1709 Fine for 1 life 1¼ years – 25

Kath. 1713 1 life John Babbacombe of Bridford tanner aged 20 – 25

Bapt. 1727 Extended value (but very little known) – 20

Fine for change of life supposed to be undervalued – 20

Kath. 1727 The above fine at ¾ lowered to – 15

Kath 1739 { ? } Bro. Griffith has surveyed the estate & thinks it worth £50 pa

Fine for 1 life 30 vacat

Kath. 1739 Fine for 1 life Elias Babbacombe upon former valuations 30 accepted

Kath. 1751 Fine for 1 life 74 vacant

Kath. 1752 Same fine repeated upon report of value to Dr Griffith – 74

kath. 1753 Same fine repeated & accepted – 74

Granted 2 tenement leases called Myland & Lelaugh at Leen, parcel of Doccombe Manor in the parish of Moretonhampstead. Town of Doccombe to West; Woods of D&C called St Thomas Cliff to east; lands called Small Rigg in possession of Stephen Berry to North; Land of John Holman of Bridford to South.

Excepted woods & underwoods.

Reserved rent 21s.2d & herriots on death of any of 3 persons by whose lives it is held

Houseboot, fireboot & wood for repairs allowed at the assignment of our woodward

Terrar to be delivered on death of each of the 3
