**SUMMARY**

4<sup>th</sup> December 1829 Letter to Mr Starr at Canterbury from J[ohn] – {*deduced from previous letter*} Jackson, cousin of Mr Germon, replying to Mr Starr's letter from 25 November 1829 about the conveyancing of Leign. Mr Germon wishes to have added his son to the Lives & has paid £327 12s 6d for it & enclosed the receipt.

The Certificate of baptism of the Son whose life Mr Germon wishes to have inserted sent you {*oblit*} last respects. I have this day paid Mes[ser]s Child & Co the sum mentioned in your letter £327 12s 6d & inclose their receipt for the same. Should any further information be required I can write for it. If not I shall wait your farther favor with the deed of Conveyance.
